Dear Cazier Cousins,

As you probably know, the Cazier Family Organization (CFO) is a non-profit ancestral family organization comprised of descendants of pioneers William Cazier (1794-1872), Pleasant Drake Cazier (1796-1864), and their ten children. Recently the officers of the CFO held two lengthy planning meetings in Salt Lake City and Springville, Utah. We covered several major topics and want to give you an update of what we are working on in regards to (1) the focus of the organization, (2) reunion plans for 2017, and (3) a special project we're doing.

FOCUS OF THE CAZIER FAMILY ORGANIZATION

There has been some query about the primary focus of the Cazier Family Organization (CFO) and its reunions. After much discussion, the officers feel, considering the number of generations involved, that we should focus most intently on ancestral heritage, family research, and family history, both as an organization and at our reunions. So you will see a bit different format and focus at our reunions. Additionally, we are seeking for more involvement by our membership and also want to better communicate with you all. Here are some actions that will help facilitate these things:

Chairperson for each child of William and Pleasant

We hope to have a chairperson and committee for each of the children of William and Pleasant. Will you volunteer to be a chair or committee member for James, Maranda, John, Benjamin, Elizabeth, Samuel, David, Charles or Rosanna? We leave out William since he died as a child with no descendants. The chair will be the central point of contact for descendants of each of William and Pleasant's children and will coordinate the work of the committee for their respective line. We envision that the chairs and their committees would gather histories, memories, stories, pictures, data, documents, etc. that exist in each family for posting on the central database, FamilySearch.org. We would like more histories, etc. from more generations to be shared across the broader Cazier Family. And so we hope you'll volunteer to participate. There are a number of databases that focus on storing historical information. We chose FamilySearch.org to store all the Cazier information because of its broad availability, widespread use, ease of use, price (free to everyone!) and security.

In a recent meeting we created a brand-new baby Facebook group: "Cazier Family Ancestral Organization". We're really jazzed about it, and it's growing! Any member of the group can add other members. - 1. <u>Family genealogy working session at the BYU Family History Library</u>
 Be taught how to use FamilySearch, how to upload your photos, documents, stories for yourselves and your own family. Learn to do research from the computer. Learn to solve discrepancies in the FamilySearch records. Work on personal histories, compile documents, etc....whatever you would like to learn or do. BYU has scanners, computers, lots equipment to use. **Be SURE to bring your passwords** or information to set up a new account with FamilySearch, etc.. Bring a laptop or ipad if you like.
- 2. <u>Tour family history sites in Nephi</u> where William Cazier and his family were assigned to settle when they first came to Utah. They were among the first settlers, and this is where William lived until he died. Nephi history is tied to our Cazier family history!!

SPECIAL PROJECT: Memorial Monument for Pleasant Drake Cazier

Our great-grandparents, William and Pleasant Drake Cazier were Mormon pioneers. The following was written about them by David Cazier, one of their ten children:

"In May 1846 the William Cazier family left their home in Illinois and all that they had, except for a few belongings that they could take with them, and joined the saints at Council Bluffs, Iowa. When they arrived at Council Bluffs, which was in the fall of 1846, they took up their temporary abode in a hay shed. The weather was cold and stormy, and as the result of exposure Mother Cazier died. There were no caskets to be had at this point and no material with which to make one. As a last resort, Father Cazier cut down a tree,

hollowed it out...and this hollow tree was used as the casket in which the last remains of their dear wife and mother was consigned to mother earth."

William married a widow in the spring of 1847. In 1851 he and his new wife (Margaret) and the four youngest of his children from Pleasant made the 1000-mile journey across the plains to Utah. William and his second wife are buried next to each other in Nephi, Utah. On their headstone is also listed the name of Pleasant Drake Cazier, even though she is not buried there.

Your CFO officers feel that it would be fitting to have a headstone in her honor placed in a cemetery in Council Bluffs, the area where she actually died. We are currently working with the city of Council Bluffs to get approval to place a monument in their beautiful Fairview Cemetery in memory of Pleasant Drake Cazier. We are anxiously awaiting their response and will keep you posted on our progress! Donations for that project will be sought...cost to be determined after decisions by the city.
